The Wells Building

Youngstown, Ohio

The Wells Building on West Federal Street in downtown Youngstown was constructed between 1915 and 1917 and has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1986. Originally built for business and commerce, the Wells Building fell vacant and deteriorated badly over the years. Through the recent efforts of the Youngstown Area Community Improvement Corporation and Strollo Architects, the Wells Building was saved from demolition.

The Wick Tower

The Wick Tower in downtown Youngstown, Ohio, is an historic treasure designed by Chicago architectural firm Daniel H. Burnham & Co., and constructed from 1906-1910. In 2015, the tower was rehabilitated in a project that converted the building to residential uses.
